





Introduction

This regional brief provides an overview of the progress in the Central Region regarding the implementation of the manifesto commitments across various sectors. The sectors covered include Education, Health, Roads, Markets, Electricity, Water, Livelihoods, the Parish Development Model, Emyooga, Judiciary and Lands, Housing and Urban Development. The Central Region comprises 25 districts, 1 city, 1,614 parishes, 324 subcounties, and 69 constituencies, excluding Kampala Capital City Authority which has a separate report.

EDUCATION SECTOR

Primary Schools

The Region has got 1,614 Parishes and of these 1,495 have got Primary Schools while 119 are missing the primary schools. On average they have 93% coverage of primary schools. These are broken down as below;

HEALTH SECTOR

Central Region has 11 district hospitals that is Nakaseke, Mityana, Luwero, Mukono, Kyotera, Buikwe, Butambala, Kiboga, Lyantonde, Rakai, Wakiso and 3 regional referral Hospital in Masaka City, Kayunga and Mubende. The Region has 69 Constituencies and of these 48 have got Health Center IVs while 21 don't have. On average the Region has a 70% coverage of Health Center IVs. These are broken down as below;





Strengthen juvenile justice system: Cases involving children (children in contact with the law and children in conflict with the law) have been prosecuted. Child-friendly spaces

have been established in Regional Offices including Mukono and Masaka. These spaces have amenities for children and are used to accommodate and prepare child-victims and witnesses for court.

Roll out the Computerized Prosecution Case Management System (PROCAMIS): The PROCAMIS has been rolled out to 25 stations including Mityana and Wakiso Resident State Attorney (RSA) offices.

In a bid to continue embracing online hearing of cases, and learning from the effects of COVID 19, the Judiciary has installed additional Video Conferencing Systems bring a total to seventeen (17). These are installed at: Supreme Court; Court of Appeal; High Court at Kampala; Commercial and Criminal Division; High Court Circuits (Masaka, and Mubende); Buganda Road Chief Magistrates Court.

The effects of COVID19 necessitated that judicial officers can work from anywhere. In order to facilitate judicial officers to write judgments, computers desktops and laptops are provided. As at October 2024, all judicial officers are provided with both a computer desktop and a laptop.

Salary enhancement for Judicial officers: According to FY 2024/25 pay structure, Judicial officers of the lower bench have so far attained an average of 84% of the approved pay target as follows: Chief Registrar – 100%; Registrars - 75%; Deputy Registrars - 72%; Assistant Registrars – 70%; Chief Magistrates - 70%; and Magistrate Grade One - 92%

Provision of transport equipment for timely adjudication of cases. As at October 2024, the Judiciary fleet stands at **389** vehicles for Justices, Judges and Magistrates to facilitate the adjudication of cases like visiting locus, inspection and supervision.

In addition, there are **223** motorcycles to facilitate process service in various courts.

Lands, Housing and Urban Development

Ministry of Lands, Housing and Urban Development has been implementing USMID-AF from 2019 to its proposed end in June 2024. Urban roads of 33.2km (2-lane equivalent) are complete Lugazi MC (10.3km), Masaka City (9.5km), Mubende MC (8.8km), and Entebbe MC (4.6km) in the Central region.

LED sub projects are completed in Entebbe (taxi park), partially complete subproject are: Mubende Municipality (taxi park and mayors garden) with physical progress of 74% and Entebbe is at 70%.

Increase the Land Fund to solve the historical dual ownership of land in Buganda. Use the principle of willing buyer willing seller to pay off the landlords and give titles to the bibanja owners. 10,861 titles processed for bonafide occupants and ULC compensated and acquired 9,120.2385 Acres of Land from Absentee Landlords from Ankole, Buganda, Bunyoro and Toro.

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Published a list of land titles in Wetlands and Forest reserves to be cancelled. 494 land titles have been cancelled, while the process of cancellation of the remaining land titles is ongoing.

Clean up the land registry and cancel multiple titles on the same land and remain with the genuine ones. Resurveyed 4 Cadastre Blocks and Insets carried out in Luwero and Wakiso

Fight the "entrepreneurs of land conflicts" for bibanja people to live in peace: In the 4 districts of Mityana, Mubende, Kasanda and Gomba, 88,149 parcels were mapped, 84,974 LIPs were issued, 1,184 applications for Certificate of Occupancy (CoO) was filed.

Launched the UgNLIS Portals to provide citizens and those in the diaspora with instant search results for land titles.

Onestop centres have been set up at the URSB and UIA to provide land services to the public

Support families to register their family land for joint economic activities: Community sensitization to register land, Communinual Land Associations, CLAs, formed in the entire Country

In bid to providing affordable mortgage finance, Housing Finance Bank has provided 4,800 loans for financing individual house and land purchases and small construction companies
