## Introduction

The Greater Ankole sub-region comprises one city and 12 districts; Mbarara City, Isingiro District, Ntungamo District, Ibanda District, Kazo District, Kiruhura District, Mbarara District, Rwampara District, Bushenyi District, Sheema District, Mitooma District, Buhweju District and Rubirizi District. This sub – region brief contains statistics of information relating to progress on Sectors of Education, Health, Roads, Tourism, Markets, Water, Electricity, Energy development, Minerals, Industry, Livelihoods, Parish Development Model, Emyooga, Judiciary, Lands, Housing & Urban Development in regard to the implementation of the Manifesto Commitments within the Sub-region.

## EDUCATION SECTOR

### Primary Schools

Greater Ankole sub- region has got 860 Parishes and in these, there are 772 Government-aided primary schools and 88 Parishes are without. On average the sub-region has a 90% coverage of a primary school per Parish. These are broken down as below;

## HEALTH SECTOR

The sub-region has one (1) regional referral hospital in Mbarara City and two (2) District Hospital in Sheema and Ntungamo District, 23 Health center IVs and 153 Health Center IIIs.

### Health Center IVs

Greater Ankole sub - region has got **34** sub-counties and of these **23** have got Health Center IVs while **11** don't have. On average the Region has **68%** coverage of a Health Center IV per Constituency. These are broken down as below;

- i. Equipment comprising 1 Motor-Grader and 1 Wheel-Loader, were procured and handed over to the respective districts in May 2024.
  - ii. The Ministry of Works and Transport continues to engage MoFPED for funds to acquire the remaining equipment (1 vibro-roller, 1 water-bowser, and 2 tipper-trucks)
- b. Allocation of an extra UGX 1bn to each district for FY 2023/24 was provided and maintained for FY 2024/25.

**MARKETS**

The Ministry of Local Government has so far constructed Mbarara City (Mbarara Central Market) and its operational with 1,403 Market Vendors.

## Water Provision

Greater Ankole sub-region is reported to be doing fairly well in regard to access to safe water. The sub – region has **85%** coverage of the **735** out of **860** parishes with at least 2 safe water sources, **125** Parishes are without and **92** Micro Irrigation schemes. Total villages in Greater Ankole sub region is **6186** of which **4494** have been served with safe water constituting **73%** villages served. The table below indicates parishes and village served with safe water.

## c. WATER FOR PRODUCTION, IRRIGATION AND SUPPLY.

Establishment of new bulk water systems for multipurpose use for dams in the area:

### **Kyenshama Dam in Mbarara district**

Completed construction of Kyenshama earth dam in Kashare S/County in Mbarara and Kashongi S/county in Mbarara to 100%. The dam has created storage capacity of 2 million cubic meters serving up to 190,000 herds of cattle throughout the year.

### **Establishment of new small, medium and large-scale irrigation schemes in Kabuyanda - Isingiro district**

Construction of Kabuyanda dam and irrigation network in Kabuyanda TC, Kabuyanda TC and Kikagata S/Counties in Isingiro District is currently at 21% cumulative progress and it is expected to be completed in 2026. Once completed, it will create a storage of 8.8 million cubic meters while serving an irrigation command area of 3,300 ha employing 32,100 people along the value chain.

#### **(iv) Support creation of water for production storage capacity by private farmers.**

The Ministry of water and environment has so far supported the private farmers by constructing Valley Tanks on Individual farms in the Districts of Isingiro, Kiruhura, Mbarara, Kazo, and Ntungamo. This has created water storage capacity serving the herds of cattle throughout the year employing some people along the value chain.

#### **(v) Extension of water supply to Mbarara Industrial parks**

##### **Kashari Agricultural Park in Mbarara**

The Kashari Agricultural Land which sits on 147.3acres is located 16km East of Mbarara in Kashari and is still under development. The park lies within the NWSC Mbarara Area service area. NWSC laid a DN50mm pipe line along the boundary of the park and NWSC will work closely with UJA to ensure that connections are made to investors as and when the developments on the land commence

**Completed construction of piped water systems in the following towns in Ankole sub – region:** Bugongi (Sheema), Ntungamo, Kyalubungu (Isingiro), Nyeihanga (Mbarara), and Sanga (Kiruhura). The systems were constructed to completion. They are managed by both NWSC and Umbrellas of Water and Sanitation.

**Construct and extend piped water supply (taps), deep boreholes, shallow wells, and protected springs to all unserved villages:**

##### **(1) Construct new large gravity flow schemes in Bitsya (Buhweju).**

Construction of Bitsya (Buhweju) at construction at 70% and is to be completed in December 2025.

**Complete and expand, under a phased approach, five water systems in Nyabuhikye and Kikyenkye (Ibanda), Shuuku and Masyoro (Sheema) and Kabuyanda water supply (Isingiro).**

- i. The Ministry of Water and Environment has completed construction and rehabilitation for Nyabuhikye and Kikyenkye (Ibanda), Shuuku and Masyoro (Sheema) to 100% handed over to NWSC.
- ii. Kabuyanda water supply (Isingiro) was completed and handed over to NWSC for Management.

##### **Rehabilitate old rural piped water supply schemes.**

The Ministry has rehabilitated and extended the 23 piped water systems under the District Water and Sanitation Conditional Grants; and, Nyabuhikye and Kikyenkye in Ibanda district; and, Shuuku and Masyoro was constructed and rehabilitated in Sheema. These systems serve over 159,260 persons.

**Invest in construction of piped water supply in small towns and growth centres. In particular, provide safe, reliable water supplies and improved sanitation facilities to all districts and sub-county headquarters.**

Completed construction of Town Water Supply System in Igorora I (Ibanda District).

**Water and sewerage services for the planned industrial parks.**

NWSC has established water supply systems for the ten (10) well-developed industrial parks out of the twelve (12) established Industrial Parks, and approximately 133 industrial customers have been connected to the NWSC Network among which with water supply in Ankole sub – region is;

**Mbarara Small and Medium Scale Enterprises (SME) Park**

The Mbarara SME Park is a 12acre facility in Mbarara Municipality and is comprised of several blocks sub-divided into workspaces for small and medium scale manufacturers. Currently, 38No. allocations have been made and the water supply in the Park is from the NWSC Mbarara Area Water supply system Boma tank whose source is R. Rwizi. All the 38No. SME allocations in the Industrial Park are connected to the NWSC network. NWSC will continue to carry out connections as and when the demand arises.

**Kashari Agricultural Land**

The Kashari Agricultural Land which sits on 147.3acres is located 16km East of Mbarara in Kashari and is still under development. The park lies within the NWSC Mbarara Area service area. NWSC laid a DN50mm pipe line along the boundary of the park and NWSC will work closely with UIA to ensure that connections are made to investors as and when the developments on the land commence.

**Development of water and sanitation infrastructure for Mbarara and Isingiro (southwestern cluster project)**

**Package 1: Kagera Water Works**

90% progress for the transmission pipeline, 90% completion of civil works for the process structures, Sheet piling works were completed at the intake, Foundation excavation works commenced at the intake, Overall progress of works is at 80%.

**Package 2: Mbarara Works**

The review process of the proposal to re-scope and re-design the construction works is ongoing and this followed receipt of high bids exceeding available budget from prospective works contractors.

## Electricity

All Districts of Greater Ankole sub-region are connected to the national grid. The sub – region has 197 sub – counties of which 193 sub – counties are connected to the national grid.

## ENERGY DEVELOPMENT

### Nuclear Energy

Baseline data on uranium prospects in Buhweju District was collected as part of the preparation of sustainable development of nuclear fuel resources project.

#### **Masaka-Mbarara 400kV Transmission Line and associated Substations Project:**

1. Right of Way (RoW) acquisition and Resettlement Action Plan (RAP) implementation is 71% complete.
2. Procurement of the EPC Contractor is underway and the project implementation is scheduled to be completed by 30 December 2025.

#### **Promotion of Renewable Energy Systems;**

1. Solar Technology Mini – Grids; Upgrades of mini-grids in Rubirizi District underway
2. Waste to Energy; Under the NAMA Biogas Project, the Ministry of Energy finalized detailed feasibility studies and ESIA's for the generation of 1MW from Mbarara City.

## MINERALS

#### **a. Geological studies and Mineral exploration;**

1. New targets of gold have been identified at Buhweju District. Over ten (10) Gold refineries have sprung up to refine raw gold into pure gold at 99.99% in alignment with the government commitment to attract investment and promote exports to support industrialization, economic diversification and structural transformation;
  2. Commissioned Wood Cross Tin Smelting Plant in Ruti, Mbarara District. The plant has an estimated production capacity of 1,600 tonnes of tin concentrate per year and 1,000 tonnes of London Metal Exchange (LME) Grade A tin metal with a minimum purity of 99.85%.
- b. Completed Mineral Beneficiation Center in Ntungamo District.

## INDUSTRY

1. The Government is decentralizing UNBS services of certification, surveillance and testing in western region (Mbarara City) in an effort to enforce quality standards of locally produced and imported goods.
2. There are two industrial parks in Mbarara and Bushenyi Districts; Buhweju and Rubirizi Districts, land has been located for industrial parks establishment.

## LIVELIHOOD

Government has extended a number of livelihood projects to the Sub-region under the Social Assistance Grant for the Elderly (SAGE), Youth Livelihood Programme (YLP) and the Uganda Women Entrepreneurship Programme (UWEP). Greater Ankole sub – region livelihood has got **27,776** Beneficiaries on SAGE with funds released **Ushs. 23,328,693,700; 46** Groups and **4,748** Beneficiaries of YLP with funds released **Ushs. 4,944,300,453; 103** Groups and **4,211** Beneficiaries with funds released for UWEP **Ushs. 4,971,911,057** as shown in the table below:
